Being hard to cultivate, and delivering only little harvest, Muscat Rose became a very rare variety nowadays, and its wines are sought after specialities. "Fine tawny colour with intense orange/apricot glints and green/yellow edge.

Fine nose, 'rose' pot pourri with hints of caramel, intense. Very rich, sweet, long, highly concentrated flavour with excellent acidity balance.
